






What were the top 5 spend categories in Brighton-le-Sands?




Where did Brighton-le-Sands residents split their wallet spend?




How much was spent in Brighton-le-Sands each month? (compared to last 4 years)






What were the top 5 suburbs visitors came from to spend in Brighton-le-Sands?












What were the top 5 languages people spoke at home in Brighton-le-Sands in 2021? Persons








What was the employment status of Brighton-le-Sands residents in 2021?
