CRITERIA

Some good examples of businesses we are looking for:

- Businesses that support, service, and celebrate the First Nations community of Bayside
- Businesses that embed a culture of understanding and respect for First Nations people in their policies, programs, and services.
- Businesses that seek to increase the understanding of First Nations people to the wider Bayside Community.



ELIGIBILITY

This award is open to businesses and non-profit organisations that:

- Are small businesses (having an annual turnover of less than \$10 million)
- Operate within the Bayside Local Government Area
- Are solely owned by, or are managed by a majority, of Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander peoples.

JUDGING

Nominations will be assessed on the information submitted and may be contacted for further information by the judging panel. The panel includes representatives of Precedent Productions, community members and at least one person who identifies as Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander, under advisory of the Aboriginal Community Development Specialist at Bayside Council.
